Kristina and her son Braden reside in South Sarasota County. Kristina and Braden have called Venice home for almost three years. Kristina was working up until summer came and then struggled to find an affordable day care for her son, Braden. This resulted in a loss of income for the family as Kristina needed to secure employment that would allow for the flexibility of her son's needs. Kristina found herself in a position where she had to secure new employment.

New employment meant that she needed to recertify her income for their apartment. There was a hiccup in documentation where the employment verification showed a significant increase of income compared to the actual pay stubs Kristina received. The apartment complex was unable to redo the certification of income at the actual

rate until the next recertification date. Kristina was unable to come up with the remaining funds and was served an eviction notice. Family Promise of South Sarasota County was able to assist the family with one month of rental assistance to help Kristina and Braden remain stably housed. Kristina has now secured two forms of employment to ensure she will remain stable in the future!

Suncoast businesses, community groups discuss solutions to affordable housing crisis

The Herald Tribune recently published an article written by Jim DeLa, Community News Collaborative. Dela summarizes the Affordable Housing Summit held earlier in November to discuss solutions to the affordable housing crisis.

Dela helps explain what affordable housing means:

'Affordable housing' defined

According to the Florida Housing Coalition, affordable housing is defined as housing that costs no more than 30% of a household's gross income. For a single person making \$35,000 a year, that would mean if they spend more than \$10,500 a year – that's \$875 a month – on housing costs, they are considered "cost-burdened."

Family Promise kept Theresa and Isaiah together and gave them the tools to rebuild their lives – Theresa honed her budgeting and planning skills and is now residing in one of FPSSC's Pathways Home units. Isaiah now has his own bedroom and the opportunity to thrive in school. Theresa works full-time as a cook. She is focused on getting stably housed and saving money.

"If it weren't for Family Promise, we would be sleeping in a vehicle," Theresa says. "Family Promise is more than shelter. Family Promise gives you the power to reclaim your life."
